Helping Dreams Come True for Children

"I feel like I won the first prize when I was placed with my foster parents." This is a remark made by Amy, a 9 year old girl who has been in our care for over a year now. Although

flattering and encouraging, it is also a reflection of the sad reality of many children in the foster care system...children whose parents have been a disappointment and unable to care for them properly.

There are many children who are abused, neglected and put into harm's way by the very ones who should be trusted to love and protect them. Many of these children have experienced trauma by those who should provide a safe and nurturing environment for them. This is often when we step into the picture.

Amy and her little sister came into our care in 2013 when Amy was 7 years old and her little sister, Susan, was just a newborn child. Their parents were controlled by a debilitating drug habit and severely neglected Amy. Child Protective Services became involved when Susan was born.

Agape Villages was called by Contra Costa County after they

had failed for days to find a foster home for these girls. It can be difficult to find homes for siblings at times. Fortunately, Agape had a loving family waiting for children just like these

girls. Agape social worker, Dave Roach, was able to say "yes, we have a home." This opportunity is changing the lives of two girls.

As you might imagine, Amy had some adjustments to make when she came into care. She was used to taking care of herself and learned in her short life that she couldn't trust her parents. Over time, Amy did learn to let her guard down and begin to trust her foster parents. They provided her and her sister a safe, loving and predictable (stable) home environ-

ment. Amy now laughs and smiles a lot! She is doing well in school and was recently selected to be on the swim team.

Amy recently stated, "My foster parents have been and always will be the real parents that I dreamed of having." We are pleased she and her sister are doing so well! The plan is for the foster parents to adopt these girls. This is another example of how, together, we are making a difference in the lives of those who come our way needing help.

One of the conditions of her coming into our care was that we find a family who would be able to keep Sofia in the same school she was attending. We did!

Sofia is currently in the 11th grade and doing well. She is very engaged at her school. She likes to participate in the extracurricular activities. She is on the softball team and cheerleading squad at the school.

Agape Villages social worker, Courtney McAlister, and the foster mother are both in the process of assisting Sofia with obtaining her driver's license, California ID and social security card. Sofia is adjusting well and getting along with the whole foster family!

The young girl came into their home a year ago. She had been removed from her parents over 4 years ago and, unfortunately, endured 3 miserable placements until coming to us. Once having arrived at her current home, she has done extremely well. The entire family loves her and she has been accepted as a member of the family.



Our Volunteer Spotlight this month is on Manteca Sunrise Kiwanis. Service groups are so important to Agape. They provide critical funds and they also help us by donating their time. Manteca Sunrise Kiwanis has been serving the community for 35 years. Each year Kiwanis clubs around the world have a day of service. It's called Kiwanis One Day. Manteca Sunrise Kiwanis Club decided to dedicate their service day to Agape Villages in February. We main-

tain a supply room for foster parents in San Joaquin County. We keep clothing, toys, school supplies, jackets, etc. in this room.



From the President

The Power of Hope

I recently saw the movie, "McFarland USA." Perhaps you've seen it. It's the story of Jim White, a cross country coach in McFarland, California (near Bakersfield). His team? Well, it was made up of the teenage children of migrant farmers. Yes, an unlikely team. They had to work in the fields to help support their families, and go to school, and add cross country running on to that -a lot!

Coach White's teams won 7 state championships, going against teams with far fewer challenges. Of course, the boys practiced hard. But a critical success factor was that Coach White believed in them, instilled in them an expectation for success and a hope of a better future. They believed and rose to that challenge and won championships.

As I watched the movie, I saw similarities to the children and youth in our care. Our children come out of tough situations, usually abuse and/or neglect. Many times they have bounced around the foster care system before coming to Agape. They often have cynical attitudes, and understandably so.

Our foster families and staff face many challenges. But as we show them stability, consistency and love, we begin to earn their trust. We instill in them an expectation for a better life. We offer them enrichment programs like sports and music, or talk about college, or how to write a resume. All of this is about trying to give them hope. This hope is about better days ahead, that their future will be different than their past.
