Sonny came into our lives as an 8 year old. His story was pretty much the same as most kids taken into the system. Yes, he was loved by his family, but he was living in an unsafe environment, constantly around drugs, and was neglected. This "little man," as I nicknamed him, was shy, but so

darn cute!

We found out when Sonny was in about the fourth grade that he had a learning disability. Like many other children, he had attention deficit disorder (ADD). So, school work has always been challenging for him.

We tried to adopt Sonny twice... each time we got to a certain place in the process and he would begin to act out. So I asked him one day, "Don't you want us to adopt you?" He replied "No." Wow, my heart broke! But he had no clue how this affected us. He wanted to just keep things the way they were. And so we did.

Sonny grew up to be a role model for others. He was an outstanding athlete at Rosemont High. His football skills and ability to run and set records in track were thrilling to see. Sonny and his 4/1 relay team went to Stanford and LA to race in "invitational only" races. This year he made it to Masters.

> Sonny applied for an internship at the Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) and is currently working his first Summer job there! Last Fall he was Homecoming King. This coming fall, he will begin classes at Sacramento State University. At this time he is wanting to become a physical therapist. He dreams of working with professional athletes someday.

Sonny is now 18 years old. The pride and love I feel for this child is indescribable. My wife and I never

needed a name change or a piece of paper to define our family. Sonny was right. The heart claims who it loves and, in our home, we are very blessed to have shared our lives with Sonny and other amazing young men. We remember Agape helping us out with sporting stuff. Look, that is now his life's passion! We are so glad we opened our home and heart to him! So is everyone at Agape!

"Michael" is 16 years old, a junior in high school, and has been in an Agape home for about 18 months. During his time with Agape, Michael has been with "Tom and Julie Wilson." Tom and Julie have provided Michael with a sense of permanency and acceptance that has led to his educational and behavioral progress.

Michael initially had issues with authority at school, but has learned to advocate for himself in an appropriate way. With Michael's cooperation, Social Worker Virginia Jensen has been able to create an educational plan that will allow him to graduate with his class.

Michael is currently working towards independence. He recently completed Agape's Living Skills Program (LSP), a five-month series of presentations for Agape Villages foster youth ages 15 years and up.

Michael has developed his artistic skills such that he won 1st place in his school's art show. Michael advanced to the school district's art competition, where he also took 1st place. Furthermore, Michael received acknowledgment of his participation and awards in the local newspaper.

Michael is a unique young man. Though life can be difficult at times, he strives to surpass his hardships and seeks to make the best of situations. His resiliency is remarkable. The future looks bright for Michael and we are thankful for him and the opportunity we have had to play a part in his life.





New Agape Offices




