A child welfare expert recently commented on some of the problems and challenges in the foster care system, including children moving from home-to-home and the difficulty obtaining counseling for children and youth. He framed it personally when he said, "I look at the overall situation and think none of us would sit still for a minute if this was our child, when in fact, these are ALL our children."

Yes, children in state custody foster care are, in a very real sense, all "our" children...our responsibility. This highlights one of the biggest challenges we have to overcome. It relates to the following idiom, "If it's everyone's responsibility, then it's no one's responsibility." This is mostly true. Why? When it's also someone else's responsibility, we let them handle it. If everyone responds this way, no one takes charge.

The antidote to this tendency is for us to be full of compassion. Have you heard that admonition before? Scriptures relate to this often as well as provide other similar encouragements, i.e. be kind, be merciful, be gracious and tenderhearted. What do these have in common? They call upon us to take the concern of those in need personally and get engaged in helping.

We've been beating this drum for nearly 57 years now as we continue our outreach to vulnerable children and youth. We are grateful for how so many have joined with us over the years. Even so, there is so much more to do, so many more children and youth in need of homes. We must respond and do more! This is what we are trying to do! Please continue to partner with us as, together, we continue to do something very special for "our" children!

"It Ain't Much, But Maybe It Will Help!" By Hank Lawson, Director, Church Relations

I travel to make presentations to congregations all over California. I want to share a story of a recent visit I had at one congregation. After I had made my presentation and after the assembly was over, a young man came up to me. He was a tall, lanky kid and he handed me an Agape Villages return envelope we place in our newsletters. He said, "It ain't much, but maybe it will help." I thanked him and shook his hand.

When I got home, I opened the envelope and a dollar bill was in there with a note from this young man. He said, "I was at the church and was inspired by your story. I myself was in foster care and was harshly abused in two out of the three. It is good to hear that your ministry tries to help those kids to have it much better. It ain't much, but I hope it will help."

I wish I had known. I would have liked to have said much more. I think of Jesus and the widow's mite. He said, "It aint much" but just maybe it was a whole lot. I don't think that young man had a lot of those "dollar bills." I am thankful, I

am humbled and I am prayerful. I believe a dollar was a lot to him. It was a gift to help others like him to have a better experience...to improve their lives and provide the prospects for a brighter future.

Being mistreated in foster care is a terrible thing. It goes against the purpose of foster care. Fortunately, it is very rare...but it can happen. That is why it is so important to screen families well, to provide close supervision/support to them and to provide good training to equip them to handle the children and youth in their care. This is how we do foster care at Agape.

A Wonderful Experience...

John, age 20, recently attended a Disneyland trip with his girlfriend and her family and had a blast. John had never been to Disneyland and had the best time of his life. He can testify why Disneyland is the happiest place on Earth! John was so excited about his time at Disneyland and he gave social worker Brian Bossemeyer detail on specific rides that he went on. He definitely wants to go back!

What a Cell Phone Means...

Foster Mother, Sandy, recently bought a cell phone for Jose. Jose has been so excited to have the phone because not only is he able to communicate easily with his Agape social worker, Brian Bossemeyer, but he is also able to communicate with his sister and mother in Mexico using calling cards. The phone can be used for emergencies to get hold of his foster mother and he also uses the phone to play games. He's loving the phone. We are pleased that Jose is even so responsible that he pays \$10 a month toward the cost of the cell phone.

Working with the Child and the Family...

Mary was first placed with our agency as a voluntary placement by her parents through the county. The initial plan was

to help this family for roughly 30 days while the parents located housing. Unfortunately, her parents' problems grew worse, especially their drug use. The County approved this situation for another 6 months contingent on the parents locating housing, attending parenting classes, attending drug classes and testing "clean."

Throughout the 6 months, our foster mother, the child's parents and Agape Villages social worker, Courtney McAlister, cooperated in working together for Mary's sake. Mary is autistic and change is very difficult for her. She calls the foster mother "Grandma" which helps as her parents are comfortable with this (not feeling in competition). Over time, a good relationship has developed between our foster parents and Mary's parents.

Social Worker McAlister has assisted our foster mother in locating resources in the community for Mary. Mary is thriving in the home and the behaviors have immensely reduced since when she first was placed. When she was first placed, she would constantly scream and throw temper tantrums. That is no longer an issue.

Our foster mother has stated that if the parents are not able to reunify with Mary, that she would be willing to keep Mary forever.


