It Started at Starbucks By Amanda Purves Agape Foster/Adoptive Mom

After years of praying about how our family was going to grow, God made it clear that Agape Villages was going to be a part of it. My husband Ryan and I had wanted to adopt. I was fearful of

getting attached to kids to have them taken away, so fostering was not an option...at least for our first year praying about it. The next year God made it very clear to me that our biological daughter was not "my" daughter but HIS and that any kids that come into our home will be HIS and not mine. We knew after that if God called us to love and pour into kids for a short time, we would do it joyfully without fear of losing them.

Through mutual friends, we were introduced to Agape. We met with Janet Kleyn at Starbucks in 2013. We had more praying and thinking to do, but we ended up being certified foster parents with Agape Villages in 2015. That September, we got a call that there were two kids who needed a foster home. The little boy was a year and a half and the little girl was 4 months. We picked them up the next day and fell in love instantly!

Our sweet boy was homeless most of his life and had seen a lot of abuse, so he needed extra love and care. When we got him he was covered in scratch marks that were infected. He also had


this asthmatic cough with no medicine. We took him and his sister to Urgent Care right away. He is now medicine free and has no more asthmatic symptoms! Praise God!!

> Our amazing girl was showing signs of delays almost immediately after we got her, so we keep track of her milestones. Agape Social Worker, Jordan Sherry, was really good at calming my anxieties and encouraging us. Today she is doing great! She still has some delays but is making progress. We are so proud of her!

While we had these sweet babies we found out their mom was pregnant. When the baby was born, they removed her and placed her with us. She is doing really well and it is wonderful to have them all together. And our biological daughter has done such a wonderful job being a big sister to all of them!

In February 2017 we adopted these precious babies and became a family of 6! And now we are ready to love and care for more babies. Well, maybe 1 more!

We at Agape are so thankful for Ryan and Amanda and the many other wonderful Agape foster parents who take such great care of "our" kids.

The Complex Nature of Foster Care

We placed an 11 year old African American female girl, "Amy," in one of our new foster homes this past year. Amy was removed due to her mother's mental health issues making it not possible for her to properly care and protect Amy. The foster home has done an excellent job caring for Amy and meeting her every need. Amy has shared that she wants the foster home to be her forever home. Amy is able to continue visits with her mother on Saturdays and with her brother who resides in the Bay area.

As foster care situations can often be complicated, it takes professional skill and coordination to work toward what we believe are best outcomes for children. In Amy's situation, a distant relative stepped forward and requested Amy be placed with her. Amy expressed that she did not want to move to her aunt's home. There were concerns about her home which surfaced.

We assembled many people who were involved with Amy to speak up on her behalf to the county worker, including her foster mother, her counselor and Agape's Social Worker, recommending that Amy remain in her foster home. However, the county set a moving date anyway. We then asked her attorney (guardian ad litem) to speak with Amy regarding her

feelings and the attorney then set a court date for a trial in order to stop the move. In court, many testified to how well Amy is doing, both at home and in school, and that it would be a disruption to move her during the school year. The judge ruled in favor of Amy not moving to her aunt's home. We will continue providing loving care and supervision to Amy's placement.


We Need Foster Parents!

EXPRESSING OUR FAITH IN LOVE

Hebrews 11:6 says: "And without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is and that He is a rewarder of those who seek Him."(nas) We read it, but what is it really saying to us?

Last year, Agape Villages turned away 1,200 children who were referred to us by the state to be cared in our foster homes. Unfortunately, we just don't have enough homes. Now we know we can't do it all, but we want to do all we can.
