day. This means that our resource parents are actively engaged in serving children in many ways, including dealing with their fears and trauma, showering love and affection on them, providing healthy meals and safe homes, helping with school work, ensuring they have appropriate medical and dental care, and in so many other ways.

All of this allows us to step in and help children when we get a call like two twin boys we've been serving.

They were born prematurely to a mother who

tested positive for drugs. Both were in the NICU for weeks before being placed with a loving Agape family. Yes, the boys had typical issues due to the drug use of their mother including being low birth weight, but our resource parents nurtured them through this.

Consider our social service staff who ensure children's needs are being met, support our resource parents and counsel with the children regularly, coordinate case planning, work with the County workers on a host of issues, take calls for the placement of new children referred to our agency and are involved in many other activities.

For each child in our care, we take on an incredible amount of responsibility. The work we do is a team effort, including As of 6 months of age, the boys are meeting their age appropriate developmental milestones. They are happy boys and have grown a lot!

The boys' birth mother has since dropped out of touch. It's possible parental rights will be severed. If that happens, our resource family would love to adopt the kids. We can't be sure what the future holds, but we are sure the kids are well cared for with us!



Showing Children a Better Way to Live

Dave and I served as foster parents for over 45 years in three different states prior to retiring. We welcomed over 400 children (ages newborn to 18 years) into our home.

We started when we lived in Georgia in the 1970s. We served with a church sponsored agency called Georgia Agape which was just getting started at that time. We were one of Agape's first foster parents.

When Dave was transferred to Michigan, we again became foster parents. This time through the county. Strangely, we had a little trouble getting licensed in Michigan because we attended church 3 times a week. Fortunately, our neighbors assured the county we were okay people!

Several years later Dave was transferred to California. We again became foster parents with the county. At that time, Agape Villages did not provide foster care services. When Agape decided to switch its focus to a foster care agency, we could not be foster parents with Agape because by that time Dave was serving on the Board of Directors at Agape.

I want to leave you with a quote from one of our grown foster children when he brought his wife to see us. He had been in our care twice and we had not seen him for years. He had put himself through college. He said when things got bad with his birth parents, he would walk the streets and say to himself, "I know there is a better way to live. I lived it with the Mitchells." He and his wife now have 2 children.

Yes, Agape has shown many children there is a better way to live. Please support the work of Agape as you can!

A glimpse of how we make a difference!

The following are some short stories from our foster care program.

One of our resource families had a sibling group of three children in their care and all was going well. Then an emergency situation occurred with the foster family. It did not involve the kids. However, we needed to move the children and we were able to secure another Agape family to take all three children. We were so pleased to be able to keep the kids together!

In these days of COVID-19, much of what we do has to involve zoom meetings. One of our teen girls was scheduled for a zoom meeting with her mother which was to be supervised by the County worker. At the last minute, the County worker could not be available. It looked like the visit would not occur. However, the teen's Agape social worker intervened and was able to be the one to supervise the zoom call. The visit occurred and went well!

One of our youth was trying to get a social security card. Her Agape social worker was able to help her accomplish this.

As many of you know, sometimes placements at Agape are only for short periods of time for a variety of reasons. Recently we took a sibling group of three children into one of our loving homes. Shortly after, a relative of the children was found and agreed to take the children. The judge approved the relative to take the children three weeks into the placement. We were happy that Agape could stand in the gap and help with that transition.



Program Activities

Adapting to the Challenges of COVID-19



Agape Villages' Program Director

Throughout these challenging times, our Agape team continues to stay positive, motivated and more dedicated than ever to ensure that we are complying with all of the latest state mandates required to keep our families, youth and employees safe with respect to COVID-19. We provide educational and extracurricular activities for our youth and families. Some are virtual and some are activities that families

can do together in their homes. We continue to provide vital information regarding resources and current updates regarding county provisions to our families and children as well.

As the Program Director, I continue to conduct weekly virtual staff meetings. We begin with a group meditation for relaxation and groundedness. Then I provide the latest regulatory updates, and give each employee an opportunity to share how they are doing. I determine if there are changes in any of their homes, and provide individual support, guidance, information, interventions and tools.

Training for our wonderful resource parents continues. Recent topics, led by Agape Social Worker Supervisors Courtney McAlister and Dave Roach via Zoom, included CSEC (Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children) and Countering the Shame of the Foster or Adopted Child: Healing the Wounds of the Past by Creating a More Loving Present.

Our important Living Skills Program (LSP) for our teens continues via zoom and is led by Agape social worker Pamela Reeves. Recently, Angelita Rincon, herself a former foster child, spoke to the teens. She connects strongly with foster teens and provided inspiration and understanding of what they are going through. She is herself a self-sufficient adult, giving back to the community.






