# Foster Care Turns Into Adoptions

When the Higby family embarked on their journey as a foster family in early 2020, they didn't set out with the dream to adopt. They simply wanted to play a part in helping vulnerable children. But God had other plans!

Their first placement was an emergency placement for 2

brothers who returned to a family member the following day.

A couple weeks later on February 28, 2020, Skylar came home from the hospital with Tonya. A reunification case that relatively quickly turned into an adoptive case.

Then on June 10, 2020, Kenny came home after his current placement had a change of circumstances. Also a reunification case

that quickly turned into an adoptive case.

Then on March 31, 2021, Skylar had a half brother born who needed a placement. So on April 5, 2021, Joey came home. An adoptive case.

Before they knew it, the Higby's were faced with the choice of choosing to adopt or not adopt their 3 beautiful foster children. And while it was not what they had envisioned or planned, God put the calling on their hearts to adopt these precious children.

On June 8, 2022, Joey was adopted by the Higby's, followed shortly by Skylar on June 24, 2022, and then Kenny on October 21, 2022!

As parents to 2 adult children (Seth currently age 26 who is married to his wife Claire, with a baby boy of their own, and Jordan, currently age 24), they thought that phase of life was over. But how wrong they were!



Tonya had always felt a pull on her heart to foster, but had hesitated, even though she had the support of her husband Doug on the journey. It wasn't until God kept placing other foster parents in their path that it became clear that the time was now. At an event hosted by a mutual friend, Tonya met

Leanne (Agape foster mom), and the subject of foster care came up in conversation.

Then their biological daughter Jordan befriended Cassidy (another Agape foster mom) through church, who then connected with Tonya. Tonya and Leanne remain best friends, and Cassidy is now quite literally considered family as she has adopted one of Kenny's biological half

sisters, and is the foster mom to his other biological sister. The Higby family and Cassidy's family love spending family time together! They've decided that family trees are too messy, so they celebrate their "family bush" because it's unclear where the branches stem from, so they just celebrate family!

Joey, Skylar, and Kenny have changed the lives of the Higby family for the better in more ways than they can say. They bring joy, laughter, and light into the lives of everyone they meet. They've taught the Higby's a new level of patience, compassion, and understanding. They've opened their eyes to just how much hurt there is in their community, but also how much healing that can take place as well. These children have shown the Higby's the goodness of God in many ways that they never expected and for that they are so grateful.

#### New Year's Eve Placement

A 3-day-old baby girl was placed with Agape on New Year's Eve. Sadly, Lucy's story is all too familiar. Mom tested positive for drugs in the hospital. CDSS got involved and Lucy was placed in a safe, loving Agape home directly from the hospital. Family visits are permitted but no family has visited. We don't know what the future holds for little Lucy, but we do know that she is safe and all her needs are being met. We will continue to collaborate with CDSS to ensure a bright future is in store for this precious child.

#### Raymus Foundation Providing Practical Help

Thanks to the Raymus Foundation grant we received, we were able to purchase clothing and shoes for a number of our children. There were 3 children in the same home. We purchased several shirts and 2 pairs of shoes for each of them. They weren't for Christmas. Just things they needed. They chose to wait till they were all home and then opened their bags together. They were so excited about what they received!

Agape Villages has been blessed to work with Fostering






